

Will of Robert Donnan, Decd.
Georgia, Marion County

Mr. J. J. Durham, W. B. Short & W. D. Crawford, were present on the afternoon of the 28th day of July, in the year 1889, at the house of J. R. Donnan, at whose house Robert Donnan died, & whom he had been resident for more than ten days before making the following will. A few hours previous to his death the said Robert Donnan, being of sound & disposing mind & memory, did call upon us to bear witness & remember what he was about to say, & did in our presence, will & desire to dispose of all his worldly possessions in the following manner & on terms:

- Item 1 He willed & desired that his two brothers, A. H. and J. R. Donnan have all the interest that he owned in the farm, which he & the said A. H. & J. R. Donnan owned jointly, also his entire interest in one steam engine which the said three brothers owned jointly, also one horse & everything in any way pertaining to said farm.
- Item 2 He willed & desired that the remainder of his property consisting of notes, accounts, one iron safe & all other personal property of any kind whatever, except as hereinbefore disposed of, to be equally divided, share & share alike between his four sisters to-wit: Mrs. C. E. Mills, Mrs. Rebecca Stewart, Mrs. Fannie Warmock & Mrs. Sallie Short.
- Item 3 He willed & desired that a check for the amount of fifty dollars which he held on the bank of "Southern States, Ga." or such part thereof as his two brothers, A. H. and J. R. Donnan should see fit to use in that way, to be appropriated to his burial expenses.
- Item 4 He willed & appointed his brother, A. H. Donnan to be his executor, to see that said will was executed as he had directed.

Shortly after giving expression to the foregoing writing & desiring the said Robert Donnan died.
