I Samuel Purdy of said State and county being very much afflicted and knowing that without an alteration in my affliction I must shortly depart this life, I hereby make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item first

I leave and devise to my beloved wife Agnes Matilda all my Estate both real and personal consisting of one lot of land containing (20 1/2) acres lying in the twenty-fifth district of Stewart County and also (25) all my stock of different kind and all other property that I possess so long as she remains a widow or during her natural life and for to manage and dispose of as her better judgment may think best and should she marry again I request that the above property be equally divided amongst my children. Should she remain a widow till her death then I wish an equal division of what property there is to be divided amongst my children.

Item second

I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Agnes Matilda Executrix and my worthy brother John Purdy Executor to this my last Will and Testament, this February 17th 1843

Item third I desire that my real Estate (viz) Lot of land No (192) one hundred and ninety two in the third district of originally Muscogee now Marion County containing two hundred and two and a half acres, also Lot No (161) one hundred and sixty one containing two hundred two and a half
