 make this my last will and Testament hereby re-
 voking annulling all others heretofore made by me,
 I desire that my body be buried in a decent and
 Christian-like manner suitable to my circumstances
 and condition, my soul I trust shall return to rest with
 God who gave it.

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 without delay by my Executor hereafter named as I am
 unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their debts
 especially as there is no necessity for delay.

I give and devise to my beloved wife Sarah Lewis
 with whom I have lived in quiet and peace for many
 years, all my household furniture, beds, bedsteads, tables, chairs,
 & also all my kitchen furniture, pots, pans, and all belong-
 ing to the same, also the linen and spinning wheel
 two cows of her own choice, one sow & five pigs of her
 own choice, one set of plow gear of her own choice
 one ash, one mending hoe of her own choice four fattening
 hogs of her own choice all the corn & fodder raised
 on my plantation the present year without reserve
 also twenty gallons of Syrup of the present crop one
 horse waggons, one turning shovel and one dozer
 plow. All the aforesaid goods & chattels & beneath
 to my wife aforesaid without reserve
 the rest of my property both real & personal not afore-
 named, wherever and whatsoever it may be I
 do hereby bequeath to be held at public sale at such time
 as may suit the case and comfort with the same
 in such cases and the proceeds to be placed to the
 payment of my just debts.

And after the sale and collection and payment of the claims against me there should be any funds remaining of the above real & personal property I bequeath the same to my beloved wife without reserve

I constitute and appoint my friend Eben & Little Executor to this my last Will and Testament this twelfth (12) day of November Eighteen hundred and fifty-two
