I Wiley Stringfellow being of advanced age and of sound mind and disposing memory and knowing that I must shortly depart this life and being desirous of disposing of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me do make declare and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all and every will heretofore made by me.

Item 1 It is my will and desire that my sons Eli, Henry, Darling & Wiley and my daughter Martha Phillips have no part or interest in my estate hereinafter disposed of as they have already had from me during my lifetime property to the full share of what they would be entitled to if what they have received should be thrown back and become a part of my estate.

Item 2 I will and bequeath all of my estate both real and personal which I now own or may hereafter own to my wife Nancy Stringfellow and my two daughters Mary Ann and Elizabeth Stringfellow. Provided that if either of my daughters should Mary then the share to which she would be entitled to under this will shall belong to my daughter remaining single and to my wife Nancy and in the event my wife should marry and neither of my two daughters Mary Ann and Elizabeth should marry then the share of my wife shall to and belong to them. Except two cows which shall belong to my wife absolutely.

Item 3 I will and bequeath that in event of the death of either my wife Nancy or my daughter Mary Ann or Elizabeth then I desire that the share of the deceased shall be equally divided between the survivors. In the event that two of the before mentioned three, viz. Nancy,

my wife, Mary Ann or Elizabeth should live then the survivor shall have the whole.

Item 4 I desire that my wife Nancy be and she is hereby appointed my Executrix.

Wherefore it is ordered and adjudged by the Court that said will be probated and admitted to record as the last will and testament of Wiley Stringfellow dec'd and that the Executrix thereof be entitled to letters upon qualification.
