

Will of William M. Cox Dec^r

State of Georgia Marion County

I William M. Cox of said County and State do hereby make this my last Will and testament.

Item first

I order and direct that all my just debts shall be paid.

Item second

I have put in J. B. Miller possession my son in law a tract of land about one hundred and eight or ten acres of land known as the Levin Carter place during my life, after that time the said land is to come in as a part and parcel of my estate.

Item third

I do will and give unto my daughter Leah C. Miller and her heirs all my personal and real estate, except one lot of land in Thomas County lying on the Rail Road running from Albany to Thomasville at occlusary depot. I forget the number & district my deeds will show the number. I also reserve my interest in the Castle Rock Cole mine in upper Georgia. These two items I have reserved out of my general estate, the Thomas County land and my Castle Rock Cole mine, I will and direct it to be given to a little girl child that I gave James Marions to raise, her name was Larral if she has any other name I do not know it lives near Dawson.

Item fourth

All the real estate of mine that I have will to my daughter L. C. Miller and her heirs at any time that my daughter L. C. will think best to sell any or all of my real estate left her or her heirs she can sell and the titles shall be good and legal provided the money she paid real estate prices be laid out in real estate again where ever L. C. will may wish and the deeds or titles be made to my daughter L. C. and her heirs if the titles is not made to L. C. and her heirs then the real estate I have left to my daughter L. C. Miller still belongs to my daughter L. C. Miller and her heirs and then L. C. M. deeds or titles will be null and void to any property I have given L. C. Miller unless the titles be made as I have willed and directed it this the 24th of May 1880

Cox signed, sealed, published and declared said will to be his last will and testament in the presence of said witnesses and the other witnesses who signed it in the presence of each other and the testator who signed the same in the presence of the subscribing witnesses, and it further appearing that said testator was of sound mind and disposing memory at the time of the execution of said will and that said witnesses all signed said will at the request of said testator.

Therefore it is ordered that said will be declared to be the last will and testament of said William M. Cox, and the same is hereby probated in Common form.
