

Last Will & Testament of Lucretia Wiley.

Georgia,

County of Effie, Henry McKimney, A. C. McKimney, and H. C. McKimney, were, on the 11th day of May, in the year of our Lord, Eighteen Hundred and Seventy Three, at the residence of Henry McKimney, in Warren County and said State, when Lucretia Wiley, in her last illness, and in perfect possession of her mind and faculties, as appeared to us, called to the bystanders and upon us in particular, to remember and take notice of what she was about to say, to wit: she said: I wish all my just debts paid; and all of my estate to be left together and controlled by my son A. C. McKimney, with my daughters, Fannie C. and Annie M. Wiley, account of a part or more. I also wish my said son, A. C. McKimney, to remain on my place in Effie County, and to act as my Executor, and to take special care of my two daughters. I also want my grandson, James Wiley McKimney, to have the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50) out of my estate, soon after which she died. And on the 13rd day of May following, this Will was reduced to writing as herein set forth.

Testament; that is to say: First, that all my just and lawful debts be paid and discharged, the residue of my Estate, real and personal, to remain as it is at this time, for my wife and children to work and make a support to remain together, until my youngest child becomes of age, and if my wife should marry, then the property to be sold and equally divided between my wife and my children, share and share alike.

I desire my Executors to sell a dot of Land I have in the Cherokee if they think best to do so. They can sell the Cherokee dot privately or publicly, if they think best for my Estate. Said dot contains 160 Acres according to the Grant.

I desire my Executors to pay all my debts, as soon as possible, without unnecessary delay to my creditors.

I likewise make, constitute and appoint my friend, John St. Ledger, my son, W. A. Bolton, and my wife, Frances Bolton, to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
