

Last Will and Testament of James Johnson.

Georgia.
Harris County. In the name of God, Amen!
I James Johnson, of said State and County, knowing that I must shortly depart from this world, deem it right and proper, both as respects myself and family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I therefore, make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item first: I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and conditions. My soul, I trust, shall return to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation, through the blessed Word and Saviour, Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed, and, as I humbly trust enjoyed for a number of years.

Item second: I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, or as soon as the circumstances will admit of it being done, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their rights.

Item third: I Will and direct that a line be run from North to South through my land known as my Hillman place, cutting off eighty six acres on the East side or end of said tract of land, which said eighty six acres of land, I Will and bequeath to my son, James P. Johnson, in trust for my afflicted daughter, Florence E. Johnson: The said land to be rented or managed by the Trustee above named, to the best advantage, for the maintenance and support of my afflicted daughter, before named; and at the death of my said daughter, Florence E. Johnson, I Will and direct that the said eighty six acres of land be sold, and the proceeds to be equally divided between my children then in life, share and share alike. Provided any my children should die before my daughter, Florence E. Johnson's death leaving a child or children, then and in that event, the child or children to be in the place of said deceased parent.

Item fourth: I Will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Frances A. Johnson, all the balance of my land, besides what I have already willed containing three hundred and forty one acres, more or less, together with all my horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, and other stock; also all my household and kitchen furniture, my plantation tools of every kind, also all money that I may have on hand at my

may be hereafter borne to me, and also my daughter, Florence C. J.

Item fifth: I constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Jane
Executive, and my son, James P. Johnson, Executor, to this my
Last will. This 3rd of May, 1869.

Item 3rd: At the death of my wife, the said Rebecca A.
give and bequeath unto my daughter, Elizabeth A. Boyer and
