Item 1st: Intending this will to be a final disposition of
my estate, I hereby revoke all wills heretofore made by me.

Item 2nd: I wish my Executor as soon as possible after my
death, to pay my debts, and to sell my property, if necessary, I
wish him to select property, which can be best used for that
purpose, and I empower him to sell the same publicly or pri-
vately, as he may think best.

Item 3rd: I desire to be decently buried, and wish my
grave neatly paved in F.C. with Tombstone, if my family
and Executor desire it.

Item 4th: I give to my adopted daughter, Crisena Conde-
lee Brooks, Five Dollars.

I then give to my wife, Sarah Louisa Watson, all of my real and
personal, and move on hand at the time of my
dying her natural life, to be used and controlled by her as she may
think best, and no claim of said Estate may be left at the death of
my wife, I give and bequeath to my dear son, John Thomas Watson

should I die, I do give, appoint my wife, Sarah Louisa Watson, my
executrix to this my last Will and Testament.

day of September, 1873.

 senses, as appeared to us, called to the bystanders and among us in
 particular, to come near and take notice of what she was about
 to say, to wit, she said: I wish all my last wills said, may all
