Whereas late of the county and state aforesaid the said Charles Roswell King and Joseph Jones estates and for certain uses therein bequeathed - and whereas in and by said last will and testament to sell or otherwise dispose of any portion of such estate upon the death of such part or portion. And whereas the said Trustees as aforesaid did upon the devisees of the estate of the said James Troup, bargain and sell two tracts of land and parcel of the equitable estate of the said Caroline & Stiles to John Hudson for and consideration of the sum of Two Thousand dollars and no cents of our money for an equivalent on the day of execution of said will and in consideration whereas the said John Hudson entered and continued in possession of said tract of land for the same and without ever receiving from the said Trustees any deed of title was filed by the aforesaid Charles Roswell King and Joseph Jones trustees of and Henry Atwood Executors of the last will and testament of John Hudson in the court house of the County of M. Tosh in the term of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven "That the said defendants Executors of John Hudson do pay over to the said Complainant from the Thirtieth day of December eighteen hundred and thirty seven a defendant as executors of John Hudson good and sufficient title for the premises by the defendant answer and according to the contract therein set forth and as now in his life time." Now This Indenture Witnesseth that the said Charles Roswell King and Joseph Jones Executors of the last will and testament of John Hudson aforesaid Henry Atwood Executor of the last will and testament of John Hudson aforesaid lying and being in the county and state aforesaid, one tract of land containing fifty acres more or less bounded East and South by lands belonging to the said John Hudson and the other tract known as White's land containing one hundred and twenty acres and over the North South and West by lands belonging to the estate of James Troup and Henry Atwood Executors of the last will and testament of John Hudson Administrators and assigns of such survivor for the sole use and benefit in use or purpose whatsoever, together with all and singular the houses and buildings privileges easements emoluments hereditaments rights members in any ways appertaining; and the reversion and reversions remainder and right title interest property or possession claim and demand whatsoever
