

In the Name of God, Am  
At Meriwether County, 3 I Abner Durham, Senior  
of the County & State  
aforesaid, being of sound mind and disposing  
Memory do make and ordain and constitute my  
last Will and Testament.

Item First I will my soul to god who gave it  
hoping for salvation through his son  
my redeemer

Item Second I will and direct that all my  
just debts be paid by my executors  
hereinafter named

Item Third I will bequeath and devise unto my  
beloved wife Frances Durham for and  
during her natural life the lot of land and  
all the improvements thereon, on which I now live.  
Also the following named Negroes (to wit) Tomeline  
Marsh, Ned, and Eliza and such of my stock  
of every description as she may desire, and such  
of my household and kitchen furniture and  
plantation tools & Wagons as she may think  
prefer to retain. Also my carriage & harness & Bel  
lives, and such amount of my stock of provisions  
of every kind as she may wish or desire

Item Fourth I will and direct that the remains  
of my estate both real and personal be  
equally divided among my children to share and  
share alike (with the exception of my daughter Anna  
who I give one hundred dollars in addition to  
her equal portion of my estate)

I will and direct that the sum of four hundred  
and sixty two dollars be deducted from the  
share of my son in law William T. Corley in the  
division of my estate. Also the amount of notes  
which I hold against my son John Durham to be  
deducted from his share of my estate the same  
being for advancements made to them, The share

To belong exclusively to her and to her children, and  
not subject to the debts, contracts, liabilities or control  
of her present or a future husband. And I hereby  
appoint Mr. Am. Henry Durham the trustee for said  
portion of my estate, and at the death of my wife  
the remainder of my estate to be equally divided  
among my children, with the restrictions and proviso  
as herein set forth.
