The State of Georgia I Abraham M. Meriwether County Mathews of the County and state aforesaid being of sound disposing mind but labouring under affliction of body have thought proper to make this my last Will and Testament

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife the tract of land on which I now live together with all the improvements thereon Also the Household and kitchen furniture plantations tools with so much of the stock of horses and Mules, Stock of cows and hogs as she desires to have, to use to carry on the business of the farm, Also the ploughs Carriage and the Negroes hereinafter named for and during her natural life.

Item 2nd I have already given to my daughter Rebecca Jones a Negro Man Jim, Bed and furniture, a horse worth about five dollars, with Saddle and Cow and calf. Also to my Sons James P. and Aquilla P. Mathews I have

given the same as my Daughter Rebecca C. Also
I have given to my Daughter Sarah C. Procter
a Negroe Woman named Sally and her two
Children, which said Negroes I Value to be
Worth One hundred Dollars more than the
Negroes given to my aforesaid Children which
said one hundred dollars I give to my said
Daughter Sarah C. for services rendered my family
before marriage, I have also given her other
property in proportion to my aforesaid children,
Also to my son Abraham M. Mathews I have
already given Money equal to the Value of
Negroes given to my aforesaid children, Also
a horse Worth seventy five dollars, a saddle,
a bed & furniture, and cow and calf here-
after to be given to my said son Abraham M.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my Daughter Eliza
M. Mathews a Negroe man named Henry
about twenty five years old, a horse worth seventy
five dollars, a saddle, Bed and furniture and
Cow and calf.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son
Adoniram M. Mathews a Negroe boy about
sixteen years old, named Wiley a horse worth
seventy five dollars, a saddle, Bed & furniture
and cow and calf forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Athanasia M. Mathews a Negroe boy named Perry
about sixteen years old, a horse worth seventy
five dollars, a Bed and furniture and
Cow and calf forever.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Ellen M. Mathews a Negroe boy named
Miles, about fifteen years old, a horse
worth seventy five dollars, a saddle, a
Bed & furniture and cow and calf forever.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son

William S. Mathews, a Negro boy named
Squire, about thirteen years old, a horse
worth twenty five dollars, a saddle a Bed
and furniture, and cow and calf, forever.
Item 8th I will that in the event any of
the Negroes given the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th or 7th
Items should die or become worthless from
disease before they shall be given to my said
children named in the aforesaid third, fourth,
fifth, sixth and seventh Items then and in
that case my said Executors here after named
shall give said child or children out of
the residue of my property a sum equal
to the value of the Negro given to my
other children

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my beloved
Wife as many of the residue of my Negroes
not given in the aforesaid Items as she may
desire. Also my Burgary if she wishes it,
and the residue of my property if any,
both real and personal shall be divided
or otherwise disposed of as my said Executors
herein after named may think best for the
interests of said Estate, and the proceeds
of the same to be equally divided among
my lawful heirs

Item 10th I will that all the property both
real and personal given to my beloved wife
as aforesaid, be further separate use and
benefit for and during her natural life
and after her decease the said property
to be equally divided among my lawful
Heirs

Item 11th I will that all my Books, as they
will sell for the said purpose, be equally divided
among all my children

Item 12th I will that my beloved wife during

her life, pay annually Fifteen dollars for the
 support of the Gospel at the Friendship Church,
 Nov 13th I hereby constitute and appoint my
 Sons Aquilla B. and Abraham M. Mathews
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I the said Abraham
 M. Mathews have hereunto set my hand and
 Seal this Twelfth day of A.D. 1853.
