Sherristown County July Term 1842
The last Will and Testament of John Wells
having been proven in Chambers upon the oath
of Abraham Harris Isiah Elmore & Thos. A. Harp it is
ordered at this regular term of Court that the same
be admitted to record.

In the name of God I, John Wells of the
County of Sherristown and State of Georgia
taking into divine consideration the mortality
of man, and seeing the time of my dissolution
as not being far distant, conceive it necessary and
therefore do make this my last will and Testament.
In the first place I assign my Spirit to God who
gave it, my Body to the dust to be buried in a
decent and Christian manner and legally as
God in his Providence has blessed me with a small
portion of temporal things, it is my will that it
be disposed of after my decease in the following
manner. It is my will that my well beloved wife
Mary do decently and comfortably supported by me
John and to reside in my house for the term of
her use of my house, how furnished and to have all
her attention that her situation may require during

life. I also will to him my negro boy Dan and one hundred Dollars in money together with her bed and bedding to be at her own disposal. So my son Joseph I give and bequeath the East side of my lands the line beginning on the mill road at the corner of my field at a post oak marked with a cross thence running along the mill road to the Thornton road, to eye ball standing between the two roads marked two oaks on each side and two black thorns along the Thornton road to a crooked black oak mark in the same manner thence a straight line out to the Thornton line, thence running back to the beginning corner, from thence partly a north course to marked white oak at the head of the first hollow, thence taking down a small rise between two hollows to the north of the lands. I also bequeath to him negro boy David and the one half of my wigger together with his horse and saddle. To my Daughter Louisa I give and bequeath my negro girl Cindy and a horse worth twenty dollars her saddle and her bed and bedding.

To my son John I give and bequeath the remainder of my land the one half of my wiggers my negro man Tom my minister boy George and Thomas and Lisan and all my other property not otherwise disposed of. To execute this my last will & testament I do appoint my son Joseph H. pastor my sole Executor in testimony of all the foregoing I have hereunto set my hand & seal as my last will and testament this 4th December 1837.
