give and bequeath to my beloved son

remainder of the former tract, and to the remainder
of the said three fourths, the said Edward M. King,
thus forth, I give and bequeath to my son, son
Edward M. King, the four hundred and thirty
Perry Allen and the remainder thereof to be put
to interest immediately after the death of my
wife and my children.

Then I give and bequeath to my daughter
Elizabeth King, after the death of my wife
and the property given her in the former, three
eighths thereof. The fourth of the death of my
wife, I desire to be held and divided among
my four children, four fourths thereof, during
their lives.

Then I give and bequeath to my son
Alexander M. Willard and my
daughter Sarah M. Willard, each one fourth of my
property of every description, the four fourths
and the said Alexander and Sarah to my son,
and the said Alexander and Sarah to him.

Then I desire that the father of the Boy
son Alexander M. Willard and
Edward T. Barron, Executor, to this my
last will and testament.

Then I desire that the father of the Boy
Perry Allen, be appointed to the raising
of my young son Edward M. King, and
