I Eliza. C. Gresham of the County and State aforesaid being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory, and knowing I am appointed once for all persons to die, do make, establish, and confirm, this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking and setting aside all others.

1st I commend my Soul to God who gave it, and desire that after my death my body be buried in a decent, plain, and Substantial manner.

2nd I request and desire that all my just debts be first and solely paid out of any money belonging to me in hand or to be raised by any necessary sale of property.

3rd I give and bequeath in Trust to my friend Wiley B. Doctor as Trustee to my beloved mother Winsom Gresham all of my property, both real and personal of whatever kind possessed for the exclusive use and benefit of the said Winsom Gresham during her natural life, and then after the death of the said Winsom, all the said remainder property I give and bequeath to my beloved brother Davis C. Gresham. of the above property the negroes are Phill, a man; Gilbert, a man; Aaron a Boy; Lucy, an old woman; Susan, a woman and her two girl children Lucy & Laura.

4th I appoint my beloved mother Winsom Gresham as executrix of this my last will and Testament hereby exempting her from all requisitions of giving security in administering my estate.

I, Selina Huddleston of the State
and County aforesaid, being weak in body but
of sound and perfect mind and memory, do
make and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following, that is to
say First I give and bequeath unto my youngest
son George Barry Huddleston all that lot or
parcel of land whereon I now live, it being
the west half of lot eighty three (83) in ninth
district of originally Trapps, now Meriwether
County. Containing one hundred one and one fourth
acres be the same more or less. To have and to hold
to him the George Barry his heirs and assigns
forever. I do also give and bequeath unto my
three sons Joseph Allen Huddleston, Miles John
Huddleston, and George Barry Huddleston
all my interest in the estate of my late husband
Allen Huddleston deceased, it being one undivided
third part of the same to be equally divided between
them. All the rest of my real estate goods & chattels
of what kind or nature soever, after the pay-
ment of all my just debts, I give and bequeath
