Hunter or any future husband, and after the death of my said Grand Daughter the said Negro girl and her increase if any to go to her children

Item Second I give and bequeath to my only daughter Eliza A. Ogletree Eight Negroes - Six thousand dollars in notes - and ^(disposes) all and every thing not hereinbefore with the right and privilege to give all or any part thereof at any time to whomsoever she may think proper

Item Third It is my Will and desire that my son Law Philomus Ogletree, have and enjoy the benefit and use of that portion given to my daughter Eliza A. Ogletree, until my said daughter shall otherwise dispose of it.

Item Fourth I constitute and appoint my son in law Philomus Ogletree Executor and my daughter Eliza A. Ogletree Executrix to this my last will and Testament
