

Georgia 30 In calm reflection
Meriwether County, the uncertainty of life,
and on the certainty of death - in sound
mind and memory I ordain this my
last will and testament in the following
terms.

1. It is my will after my decease to be
buried in a decent but plain manner.
2. That all my just debts be paid out
of such money as is now due to
my estate.
3. That that portion of my landed estate
lying and being in the seventh District
of this County at present but formerly
Group City numbers 64, 96 and part of
97 in sd. district together with whatever
of my stock farming utensils house-
hold goods, may be deemed super-
fluous or unprofitable, to kept in
and for my family may at the discre-
tion of my after named executor or
executors be sold, and due return
thereof be made to the proper tribunal
in this County together with all sum
of money due my estate at my decease.
4. That my beloved wife Eliza remain
in the possession of my entire estate un-
divided so long as she is in Midwifhood
or during her natural life with these ex-
ceptions - viz - If during the minority of
either of my daughters they or either of
them should marry; then in that case
that a just valuation of my estate be
made by five just Competent and
uninterested persons and they or
either of them receive a just distri-
bution thereof

independence and education during their minority or while they are minors from my estate while it remained undivided and undistributed.

1st. That my wife Eliza during her widowhood shall use her discretion at the extent of education each of my children shall receive provided it amounts to a good English education and that if any one should be continued with the intent of pursuing an education beyond that time or course generally received by them so as materially to increase the cost on the estate while undivided in that case it is my will that such expense be correctly ascertained and kept as a charge against such one on receiving his or her distributive share.

2d. That my sons during the time of their minority when not at school be kept and raised to an honest occupation and on their arriving to the age of one hundred twenty years that they each receive one third part distribution of my estate in the principle of distribution also provided for my daughters in the fourth item as will be provided for hereafter.

3d. That in case my beloved wife Eliza should again marry in that event it is my will, that there shall be five competent and uninterested men chosen or appointed, to make full and diligent inquiry into the then value

I have on the last of
beloved wife's departing this world
ordered that a division be made
as above directed in this will to
my surviving heirs and in either
case that a guardian be appointed
for each of my children that may
then be in their minority according
to the direction of the laws of this
State in such cases who shall take
into care and management that
portion of my estate that shall fall
to the heir of which he may have
the charge.

Gth. It is my will that this my last will
and testament be put in execution
all its items and intentions by my
dear wife Eliza alone whom I do
here appoint and ordain for that
purpose during her widowhood or
her natural life. Signed sealed this

of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty six in the presence of

to power to convey or dispose of
parts of my real or personal prop-
erty under the following condition
viz. that if circumstances or
otherwise make it necessary
