Whose Religion I have professed and as
I firmly trust enjoyed for forty years
Second I desire and direct that

all my just debts be paid without
delay by my executor executing hereafter
named

Third I give and desire to my
beloved wife Eleanor for and
during her Natural life or widowhood
and to my son Floyd I and to my son
Andrew lot of land Number 23 Twenty
three in the Ninth District of originally
Township but now Meriwether County
Containing two hundred two & a half
acres more or less with all the rights
Members and appertinances to said
lot of land in any ways appertaining
or belonging to their own proper use -

benefit and behoof forever.
I also give ~~and~~ ^{with} ~~behoof~~ ^{to my wife Eleanor}
in the same reserved manner and to my
son Floyd T. and to my son Andrew all
of my household and kitchen furniture and
all my farming utensils used in and
belonging to my plantation of my description
also my gun and thrasher & and all
things belonging thereto. Also all of my
horses and cows hogs and sheep part of
even my blacksmith's tools also all my crop

Also at the death or marriage
of my wife Eleanor that part or portion
of property given to her which is named
in this item I give to my son Floyd T.
Also on the death of my son Andrew that
part or portion of property given to him
which is named in this item I give
to my son Floyd T.

Item Fourth I give to my wife Eleanor
for and during her natural
life or widowhood and to my son Floyd
and to my son Andrew my Negro man
Henry and my Negro girl Sally with
her future increase and at the death
or marriage of my wife Eleanor that
part or portion of property given to her
which is named in this item I give
to my son Floyd T. and at the death
of my son Andrew that part or portion
of property given to him which is
named in this item I give to
my son Floyd T.

Item Fifth I give to my son Floyd T.
a lot of land numbered 293 two
hundred and ~~two~~ ^{two} acres in the third
district and the section of Cherokee =

544
- Land containing forty acres more
or less Also lot of land Number (545)
five hundred and forty three in the
Thirtieth district and third Section of
Cherokee County containing forty acres
more or less Also lot of land Number
(530) five hundred and twenty in
the first district and fourth Section
of Cherokee County containing forty

Number (579) two hundred and twenty
nine in the twenty third district and
second Section in Cherokee County
containing One hundred and fifty
