through the Merits of his Son my Saviour and my Body to its Mother to be decently buried

Secondly It is my desire that all my just debts be paid from the proceeds of the present crops of Cotton and Corn which will I think be sufficient to meet all demands against me

Thirdly It is my desire that after my death that my property be and remain together

without division or sale for the use and benefit of my beloved wife Sarah during her lifetime and at her death that an equal division be made of said property among my legal heirs then living and it is furthermore my

desire that my beloved son Robert remain with his mother and take the charge and Management of the farm and amply provide for the comfortable maintenance of my said wife and to receive for his services such Wages as may be agreed upon by him. My son Robert and my Executors at the Commencement of each year

Fourthly It is my desire that my beloved wife Sarah and my beloved son Robert remain together at my residence until the death of my said wife

Fifthly, I do hereby appoint my Beloved Son
Isaac Norton Wilcox, Esq. and my
Beloved Wife Sarah Wilcox Esq. to carry
into effect this my last Will and Testament
