transitory life do therefore make ordain
publish and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament That is to say -
First after all my lawful debts paid
and discharged the residue of my
Estate real and personal I give bequeath
and dispose of as follows to wit -
To my beloved Wife two Negroes viz Henry
and Nancy a horse worth five or six
hundred dollars my Buggy and two mules
(viz) Beck and Ned Provision sufficient for
ten years Maintenance and all my house-
hold furniture except what I bequeath
to my son James during her Natural life
or Widowhood

To my Son James No my Saddle Mare Saddle
& bridle One Cow & calf One Bed & bedclothes
the remainder of my Estate to be sold &
the proceeds equally divided between
Surviving Children

I Hence I make constitute and appoint
my Son William Alexander Fuller, my
Son in Law Charles H. Butler and
my Wife Nancy Fuller to be executors
of this my last Will Testament hereby
revoking all former Wills by me made

In Witness whereof I have hereunto
Subscribed my Name and affixed my
Seal this Twelfth Second day of October in
the year of our Lord 1831 and
