Georgia { In the name of God Amen
Barnes County { I the said J. J. Foreman do hereby certify
that by these presents, I J. J. Foreman of the County of Barnes
aforesaid being weak in body but of sound perfect and
disposing mind and memory do this day make and order
this my last will and Testament as touching all such
worldly goods and effects as I do possess and
which I now possess, I dispose and
bequeath in the manner and form following.
First I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary
Foreman for & during her natural life, provided she
remains in widowhood, all of my Property and Estate
real & personal. I direct & bequeath to her for her
own use and benefit, and to have in her own right
all of my house hold & kitchen furniture

Subject to her now disposal as she deems proper at
or before her death.

Second I do give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter in
Law Sarah Brantly for and during her Widowhood
an equal right with my wife Mary Brantly of com-
pany in my present dwelling house and other real
buildings pertaining thereto. I do furthermore give
and bequeath to my said Daughter in Law after
the death of my wife one half part of all the real
estate remaining real and personal to wit. One
half part of my land and ~~the~~ use of my dwelling
house, and of the houses pertaining thereto and per-
sonal and one half of all the Stock of Hogs Horses
cattle &c. to have and to keep for her now use and
benefit during her natural life or Widowhood.
And at her death or marriage I bequeath the
said property being assigned to her for this period
to her heirs by my Deceased Son Edward Brantly.
to be equally divided between each of them as may be
then living.

Thirdly, I do give and bequeath to my beloved Son
Lewis Brantly, at the death of my wife Mary
the remaining half of all my Estate real and
personal.

Fourth having given to Bigger Sanders the
former husband of my Daughter, Mary a negro
girl named Mary and considering that to be a just
and full part of my estate for his distribution there-
of, I give and bequeath to him at my death
the further sum of two dollars.

Fifth I give and bequeath to Zachariah Butler
the sum of two dollars, he being the lawful
husband of my Deceased Daughter Francis.
Having given to my Son and Daughter Francis full
a negro girl named Sarah, which I considered a
full and just part of her Mother's distribution
of my Estate.

Sixth I do give and bequeath to Peter S. Bridges the sum
 of five hundred dollars the sum of two dol-
 lars Harry hantford give to him as his ~~share~~ ^{portion}
 portion of my estate a negro girl married by Nathaniel
 Smith I do give and bequeath to John Adams two dollars
 the sum of two dollars denning that sum of which he
 will be entitled to as the legal husband of my Grand Daughter
 Sarah Smith having formerly given him a negro boy named
 Jerry. Who after being attested to him died before taken home
 And I do hereby constitute and appoint my true
 friend Pleasant Rusk and James Kendrick my
 Executors to carry this Will into effect after paying
 out of my Estate all my lawful debts and I do
 hereby revoke and disannull any and all other
 Wills heretofore made by me. In testimony whereof
 I have unto set my hand & affix my seal this the twenty
 third day of May in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and forty.
