I John Buice of the County and State aforesaid
being of sound disposing mind and memory
and knowing that is appointed for man
once to die do make and establish this to
be my last will & request revoking all others
that I have heretofore made.
First I give to my wife two negroes Henry
and Harrison one horse two cows and
calves of her own choice one bed and
furniture my household & kitchen furniture
with one years provisions and the land
on which I now reside this property I
wish my wife to have during her life
or widowhood and after to be sold
and equally divided between my
children or their heirs.
I give to my daughter Elizabeth one
cow & calf and ~~one~~ bed & furniture
of her choice
I give to my grand son Joseph & John

Evans One Hundred and forty six
 Dollars each included in this amount Eight
 ten Dollars each which I owe a piece to be
 kept by my Executors until they become of
 age I further give to my sons Samuel & Clinton
 "David One Hundred Dollars each to be deducted
 from my daughters part & also the mother
 "of said Children.
 "The balance of my Estate both real and
 personal I wish sold and the proceeds
 (legally) divided between my Children
 "Wm Quice Joseph Quice Nancy Edmonds
 "Elizabeth Quice Delila Jennings the above
 "Two Hundred Dollars to Samuel & Clinton
 "to be made from Delila Jennings portion
 "Jonas Quice & Sally Evans sons & Joseph
 "and John Evans and Susan Florence
 "The sons of Sally Evans Joseph and John
 "to receive the portion of one Legatee.
 "My son Wm Quice has received 825 dollars
 "Joseph Quice 405 dollars Nancy Edmonds
 "425 Dollars & Jonas Quice 225 Dollars more
 "than the rest of my Children (which amounts
 "I wish them to account for ^{before} they receive
 "any more as I wish all my Children
 "to have an equal share of my Estate
 "I Appoint my sons Jonas Quice & William
 "Quice my Executors to this my Last will
 "and request to carry into effect all that I
 "have herein set forth.
 "The above will witnessed On Testimony
 "whereof I have hereunto set my
 "my hand and seal this 30th day of
 "January 1841.
