Item I desire that my body may be entred

as possible and that my funeral sermon be
preached either at my death or at any subsequent
time, but I leave to my relatives and friends the
exercise of their own discretion in regard to this
matter.

Item I give and bequeath all of my property
both real and personal after the payment of
my just debts to my beloved wife Sarah J. Park
leaving it to her own judgment and discretion to
give to any or all children whatever part of the same
she may feel able to give without inconvenience
to herself.

Item I hereby appoint my beloved wife
Sarah J. Park ~~the~~ executrix of this my last
will and testament and desire that she should
not make any returns to the Court of Ordinary
but it is my wish that she should manage and
control all of the above named property in the
manner she may think best, and that she may
sell and dispose of all or any part of the same
for the benefit of herself or any children if she shall
think proper to do so without any permission or
order of the Court having cognizance in such
cases.
