Notes, Carriage and horses, also my servant
Wm Cornbliss.

Third It is my wish and desire that my
beloved wife shall have and use the above
named property for and during her natural
life and at her death to dispose of the same
as she may think best by will or otherwise.

Fourth I appoint William Reeves my
step son my Executor hoping he may
execute the same.
