Nuncupative Will

We Richard Fleming, John Douglas and
William Robinson on Thursday and Friday
the 2nd and 3rd day of September last past of this year to wit (1858)
Eighteen hundred and fifty eight at the residence of Lawrence H. Tarrar
a single man before and at the time of his death, about nine
o'clock on Thursday ^{the 2nd day} of said month to wit
September when he was in perfect possession of his mental faculties

he called upon us to remember and take notice of what he was about to say he wished us to understand that his will and desire was, that first after his death his just debts should be paid, and then the balance of his property should be distributed to his mother (Rebecca Tarrar) and his sisters (Margaret & Angelina) and that the balance at their deaths if any should be equally distributed among his relations generally. He said that the Mother and sisters aforesaid could do as they pleased with the property and requested that his sister Angelina with any one she should choose should carry out these his desires in this regard, and that he died about 9 O'clock on the following morning to wit. September 8th 1858, this October 1st 1858
