life deem it proper to dispose of
my worldly interest so that I may make
this my last will and Testament
Herein I desire my body to be buried
in a decent Christian like Manner,
my soul I recommend to God who gave
it hoping to receive eternal life through
the merits of Jesus Christ my Redeemer
I give and bequeath my entire
interest in the Estate of my son P. M.
Robertson dead which is in the hands
and control of my son James M. L.
Robertson Executor of the last will and
Testament of said P. M. Robertson dead
in the following Manner to wit, I
desire and direct that the annual
Interest of One thousand dollars be
allowed for the support of my sister
Jocelyn Mitchell during her natural
life & that the said sum be kept and
retained by my son James M. L. Robertson
and the interest of the same paid over
to my sister Annually after the same
shall become a cash fund in his
hands during her natural life
as aforesaid the balance of the
Estate I desire and direct to be divided equally share

and share alike, (including the
 thousand dollars for the benefit of
 my children after my death) between my
 son James M. Robertson and my
 daughter Sarah F. Park my daughter
 Martha Abbott and one third to be
 equally divided between George S. &
 John Freeman the executors of my deceased
 daughter Caroline Freeman. I ordained
 the said George S. and John Freeman
 shall not attempt or in any manner
 aid and assist to set aside the last
 will and testament of my said
 deceased son L. M. Robinson there in
 that event they shall have no part
 or share in my interest in said
 estate aforesaid. But that the same
 shall go to in equal share or parts
 to my three first aforesaid
 I am to be constituted and appointing
 My beloved son James M. C. Robertson
 Executor of this my last will & testament
 this the thirtieth day of June A.D. 1857
