- 1st I Bequeath to my beloved wife Silvia Clover all
my estate during her widowhood and natural
life with the exception of three negro boys and at
her death the lawful heirs of her body
2nd I will and bequeath to my grand son David
G. Gless a certain negro boy by the name of Tom
3rd I will & bequeath to my grand son William P.
Gless a certain negro boy by the name of Ben.
4th I will and bequeath to my grand son James P. Gless a certain
negro boy by the name of Dred.
5th It is my will that C. H. Williams and Jas. B. Gless
should act as my executors and my wife Silvia
Clover executrix to this my last will and testament
the 9th Oct 1840 signed
