I wish my Body decently buried & Expenses for
the same paid & all my just debts Paid

Article 8th I have given to my son William his fair portion of my estate for the present until my father is removed up and the other children get as much in proportion as he has got. the following is the list of the property which he now holds in Massachussetts one horse saddle and bridle worth one hundred dollars, one bed and furniture worth forty five dollars, one cow and calf worth twelve dollars, meadow and ^{part} ~~other~~ ^{land} worth five dollars & two sheep worth two dollars.

Article 2^d I give unto you Sam.
Robert, one horse they call John a saddle and bridle
worth one hundred dollars one bed and furniture
and one cow and calf one Saw and Saps & two Sheep
they to be worth sixty four dollars.

Article 8th give to my daughter Eliza one horse
they call Ginn & saddle and bridle worth one hun-
dred dollars one bed and furniture one Cow & calf
one sow and pigs and two sheep and worth sixty four
dollars.

Article 4th I Give and bequeath to my
dearly beloved wife Nancy Hamilton her life time
the Liver Plantation where we now live together
with all the appurtenances thereto belonging together
with the House hold and kitchen furniture & all
stock of every kind all for her use & the use of her
support & schooling of the younger children
to wit all other. To have full power &
last & when all of which I wish to be done.

the farm &c and as they become of age or marry
to be given off in proportion to those who have
received their portion and when all of my money
this is received and each one receives his portion
and at the death of my wife if there is any thing
more it is to be equally divided among them all.

Article 6th When all my monies are collected and
debts all paid if there is surplus of money on hand
I wish it to be applied to the purchase of a negro
woman for the use of my wife Nancy her life
time and the younger children which are living with

Article 6th I further wish my part of the medical
shop & drugs &c therein contained to be sold and the
proceeds thereof applied to the use of the family.

Article 7th I do further appoint Robert Hamilton &
Robert C. Finner my Executors to Administer
the Business of the estate. Signed with my hand
dated this the seventeenth day of November in the year
of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty one in the
presence of witnesses.

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Leaving Lydia Sarah & Nancy Husley and my
wish is the part or portion that falls to my share
the Mary Farrow share belong to the lawful heirs
of her body. I also give and bequeath unto Franklin
Farrow one dollar. I also appoint and Ordain my
Friends Francis Carlile Samuel G. Carlile and
John Disminch my lawful Executors of this my
last will and testament in testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21st
day of December 1840.

that I am worth to wit, My lands all my
stock House hold and kitchen furniture to
go with all my ready money and jewels
and at her death or as soon there after as practi-
cable for all my estate to be equally divided among
my Children, each to have & share about with
the exception of my Daughter Elizabeth Winsten
deceased whose Children will at the death of my
Wife will be entitled to the amount of two hun-
dred dollars, And I do also constitute and appoint
Emily Bird my wife and James Addison Bird
my Son my Sole Executors to this my last will
and Testament. In testimony whereof I affix my
hand and seal this fifth & day of January A.D.
1842 Eighteen hundred & forty two in the pres-
ence of a Just.
