had that amount. It is my wish however that
my son Nicholas Guice in place of the fifty
five dollars that he have a horse bridle & saddle
worth one hundred dollars And it is fur-
ther my will that my Executors herein after
named have power to look out a place where
they in their judgment may think best to purchase
land suitable for the accomodation of my fam-
ily & that they advertise & sell at publick sale the
land I now own together with all and any other
property which the family may not have use for
And it is further my will that my beloved
wife Rachel Guice & Rutledge Moran be my Executors
& Ext- to bring this my will into Execution.
