Henry, in This Indenture made this fifth day of March
 A.D. 1874 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight
 Hundred and Seventy four between G. H. Head
 of the County and State of Iowa of the one part, and W. J.
 Lawson of the same place of the other part. Witnesses that that
 the said G. H. Head for and in Consideration of the sum
 of One Thousand Five Hundred and Twenty seven $3\frac{1}{2}$ 00
 Dollars to him in hand paid at and Before the sealing
 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby
 acknowledged hath granted, bargained, sold and conveyed
 and doth by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey
 unto the said W. J. Lawson, his heirs and assigns all the tract
 or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the County
 and State of Iowa in the Middle Smith District of the County
 of Iowa being a part of the lands where the said G. H. Head
 now lives commencing at the north-west corner adjoining
 Hilliard Ranches running said line forty chains and
 seven links, East from thence. Twenty six chains eighty
 one links, north from thence seven chains, eighty one
 links west adjoining J. C. DeSapierre from thence running
 said line north to the public road, from thence running north
 up said road west to J. C. DeSapierre's line from thence run-
 ning north said line to the corner said tract of land ad-
 joining E. C. Thrush, G. H. Head, J. C. DeSapierre and Hilliard
 Ranches containing according to survey One hundred and
 twenty one and a quarter acres also a certain parcel or tract of
 land lying & adjoining the lands of J. C. DeSapierre on the
 west, commencing at the south west corner of said lot at a
 pine stub sitting in the road leading from the Flat-Shoals to
 Rocky Mount, then running south with an old fence to the
 back of an old field to a pine stub, from thence east to
 the corner of said field to another stub from thence north-
 east running with the old fence to the road to a pine stub
 thence running east to the corner of J. C. DeSapierre's land
 to a pine stub, making eleven rods, seven feet and a five
 inches, from thence running north until crossing a branch
 adjoining J. C. DeSapierre's field at a pine stub from
 thence west to a post oak at the corner of said field
 from thence north to the corner of J. C. DeSapierre's land
 at a pine stub, from thence west two rods on said line
 from thence running south west to the starting point
 at the road where the boundaries of the land com-
 menced. Said parcel or tract containing thirty two
 acres & a half adjoining J. C. DeSapierre on the east
