my last will and Testament, I wish after my
death to be buried in a plain and Christian like manner
and recommend my soul to God who gave hoping
at the resurrection to receive ^{renewed} eternal life through the
merits of his Son my Redeemer
I do disposing of my estate First I will and
bequeath that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate
and I will and desire that all my
property Real and personal be kept together
by my Wife Eleanor Pennington and my
heirs Plantation cuttivated for the support of
my Wife and the raising of and educating my
children as long as they are minors, Or if my
Wife should marry or die then and either event
I wish that all my Estate at that time to be equally
divided between Wife and children share & share
alike first deducting from the share of my daughter
Elizabeth Peter the sum of five hundred
dollars she having already received that amount
from my Estate.

Third I will and desire that
upon the marriage of any of my children if that
event should take place before the wife before named
that my Wife shall give them off such amounts
as they may in her discretion think proper at the
same time taking a Receipt from such child or
children as a part of their distribution share and
that he she or they be charged accordingly.

Fourth I will and desire that Abraham Key and
my Wife Eleanor Pennington carry out and
execute this my last will and Testament.

And do nominate and appoint them my Executors
and Administrators
