Item 2^d After my death I wish all my just debts paid as soon as possible should I be owing any.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Morgan all my negroes that I may have at my death with all my other property and effects that may belong to me of every kind & description whatever to have during her natural life.

Item 4th After the death of my wife my will and desire is that all my negroes stock of every description and effects of every kind and all my other property whatever that may be remaining after the death of my said wife to be equally divided among my four children (to wit) Henry C Morgan, Susannah Withnall William Morgan, & Wiram Morgan, Except one Negro woman Julia Ann, I will and give her to my said Son Wiram Morgan over and above the rest of said children.

Item 5th The property that I have heretofore given off

to my said children I hereby assign
