Muscogee County
In the name of God Amen
I William Plant of
said State and County being infirm and
believing that I must shortly depart from
this world do hereby right and proper
both as respects myself and my family
that I should make a disposition of the
property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me. I therefore make this
my last will and Testament hereby revoking
and annulling all others heretofore
made by me.
Item 1st - I desire and direct that my
body be buried in a decent place
Manner suitable to my circumstances
and condition -

Item Second I desire and direct that all my
Just debts be paid as soon as possible
by my executor herein after named

Item Third I give and devise to my wife Lucretia
during her life or Widowhood eleven
Negroes to wit Ned and Jimmy and their three
children as follows, Philip a man 22 years old
Martha a Woman 20 years old Chas a boy 18
years old, Tom a boy 15 years old, Silas a girl
13 years old George a boy 11 years old Henry a
boy 9 years old Mary a Girl 4 years old, Elizabeth
a girl 3 years old.

Item Fourth I give my Wife my carriage and
harness and all of my Stock horses
wheeled cars &c during her life or
Widowhood at her death or Marriage the
property to be equally divided amongst all
of my children, James & Pellen that married
My daughter Elizabeth has had five hundred and
twenty five dollars which I desire to stand
good against his part of the estate Also my son
John A Plant has had five hundred and
twenty five dollars which I desire to stand
good against his part of the estate

Item Fifth I bequeath to my Minor son Thomas
the Plant a Negro girl named Harriett
14 years old and all her increase to his
use and benefit

I constitute and appoint my Wife
executrix and Penderton of Robinson Executors
to this my last Will and Testament
this the 18th of September 1853.
