In the name of God, Amen I William Sewell of the State and County, knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as regards myself and family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me with. I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others hitherto made by me.

Item the first,

I desire and direct that my Body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life, my Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it.

Item the Second,

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without unnecessary delay by my Executors hereafter by me appointed.

Item the third,

I give and bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Martha, Lot Land Number One hundred and five in Cleveland District originally Lump now Meriwether County, Containing Two hundred two and a half Acres more or less with all the rights, minerals and appurtenances to said lot of land in any wise belonging to her own proper use and benefit during her natural life or widowhood. I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife in the same ~~Massachusetts~~ all my Farming Tools belonging to my farm of every description and Two Horses, and two Cows and Calves, two Dogs and Pigs if any and all of my Household and Kitchen Furniture, except One bed and bedding and one Chest or Trunk, also One years provision.

Item the fourth,

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood my Negro man Sam and a Woman named Frances and her child.

Item the fifth.

I give and bequeath unto my son William J. Sewell, One bed and bedding, One Trunk or Chest, One Cow and calf, and my family Yards; one Horse and Saddle.

Item the sixth,

I desire and direct that all my property not named in this my will be sold by my Executor and the proceeds after paying my just debts be equally divided between my beloved wife and children first, Martha my beloved wife, my daughter Sarah E. Wagner and her children, my two sons Jacob R. and William J. Scovell each an equal part, that is to say all the three children in the advance made by me shall be made equal and then my beloved wife to share equal with them in the remainder.

Item the Sixth,

In case my beloved wife should marry then I direct that all the property bequeathed to her above shall be sold and the proceeds be equally divided with her and my three children above named.

Item the Eighth,

I hereby appoint my Sons Jacob R. and William J. Scovell Executors to this my last Will and Testament,
