Miller County Wills 1871-1925
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Last will and testament of Martha J Harrell of said state and county.

I, Martha J. Harrell, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, a resident of said state and county do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me:

1st I desire that I be given a Christian burial.

2nd I appoint Minnie Harrell executrix and Henry Harrell, executor of this my last Will and Testament and they are not to give bond to any court or to any one and neither are they to make any returns to any court or to any one but are to act jointly in carrying out the provisions of this Will and neither one of them is to receive any compensation for carrying out the provisions of this Will

3rd I give to my four beloved sisters \$100. in cash each and no more and I give to my two brothers \$100. in cash each and no more.

4th I give to Maude Little \$500. in cash and no more, I give to Lizzie Humphrey \$500. in cash and no more

5th I give to Will Smith \$600. in cash and no more.

5th I give to Mrs. Alice Griffin Powell \$100. in cash and res. more.

7th I give to Mattie Mae Harrell \$100. in cash and res. more.

8th I give all land of whatever value and land with all improvements thereon to my friend Mrs. Minnie Harrell, the executrix of this will. I also give to my friend Mrs. Minnie Harrell all cash that I may have on hand after the other beneficiaries have received their part as indicated in this will, and I also give to my friend Mrs. Minnie Harrell all the residue of my property, whether in cash, choses in action, accounts, or land, or personal property after my death which has not already been bequeathed in this will to the other beneficiaries; in other words after the amount of money has been paid over to the parties indicated in this will then all the balance of my property is hereby given and bequeathed to Mrs. Harrell, my friend who has been so kind to me during my last days upon this earth. All either of the parties named as executor or executrix of this will die before it takes effect, then the surviving one shall execute the provisions of this

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will and should both die prior to my death then the Judge of the Superior Court of the Paulina Circuit is hereby directed to appoint an executor of this will who must carry out the provisions as here in outlined.

In testimony whereof, I have hereto set my hand and seal to this my last will and testament, after same was carefully read over to me by W. I. Green, in the presence of the witnesses thereto.
