testament, relieving her of making any returns
whatever, or of accounting for any of the above

INK BLEEDING THROUGH

Last Will and Testament of Zack Taylor Williams.

Georgia, Miller County.

I Zechariah Taylor Williams, of said County and State, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament, hereby revoking a will made by me on the 8th day of April 1903 and recorded in Record of Wills pages 33 in the Ordinary's office of Miller County Georgia on December 14th 1904, as well as any and all other wills heretofore made by me.

First. I desire my executors hereinafter named, as soon as possible after my death, to pay all my ~~just~~ and honest debts. In ~~the~~ event I do not have enough cash on hand to pay my debts, I devise and direct that my executors sell my stock of Merchandise and pay all of my indebtedness, provided I am in the Mercantile business at the time of my death. If I am not in the Mercantile business at the time of my death, then I direct my executors to sell that portion of my estate that is most advantageously sold.

2nd. In view of the fact that my beloved wife, Clara D. Williams lent me \$2400. when I started into the Mercantile business for myself, I desire that she be repaid said sum immediately after my death, by my executors as stated in paragraph 1st of this will. I also declare and publish that the business run by me at this time belongs to me and my family, with the exception of the

\$2400.00 abode named.

3rd. I give and bequeath to my son Bryant Williams, of Oconee County Georgia, the sum of \$5.00 (Five) which I directed be paid to him by my executors.

4th. I hereby bequeath and give unto my beloved wife, Clara G. Williams and my two sons, Jack Hunter Williams, Phil Edwin Williams and to my daughter, Chloe Georgia and to any other children that may hereafter be born to me and my wife, share and share alike after the \$2400. has been paid to my wife and the \$5.00 paid to Bryant Williams and all of my debts paid, all of my estate consisting of real estate, personal property including lands, notes, mortgages, accounts, choses in action and all other property of any kind whatsoever.

5th. I hereby appoint my wife Clara G. Williams, Guardian of all of my children without bond to accept their share of said estate and to keep said estate intact untill said children are of age, using the income derived from said estate in maintaining and educating said children.

In the event of a second marriage of my wife Clara G. Williams, I then direct that my executors be jointly made guardian of my children without bond.

Sixth. I appoint my two good friends C. C. Bush and P. E. ~~Miller~~ ^{Miller} both of Colquitt Georgia, as executors of my estate to

handle same without any orders of Court and using their best judgment at all times and in the interest of my wife and children. In event of the death of one, the other shall act and is hereby clothed with all powers that both now have.
