

3rd I give in a very low state of health knowing that I must shortly depart from this world deem it right & proper both as it respects myself & my family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will & Testament hereby revoking & annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent & Christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances & Condition.

2nd I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named. As I am unwilling my Creditors should be delayed of their rights

3rd I give and devise to my beloved wife Frances with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet & love for five years, the following real estate, as follows. Lot 6, Numbers four hundred & fifty four (464) & four hundred & fifty five (465) in the 2nd District & second Section, containing forty acres each more or less. About fifty acres of which are cleared & in Cultivation with all the rights messengers & appurtenances to said lots of land in any wise appertaining, or belonging free from all charge or limitation whatever to her own proper use benefit & behoof forever, with full power to dispose of the same at any time with full power to lay out the proceeds thereof in other lands that be more suitable to the convenience of her & that of my children, during her natural life. And at her death, then to be equally divided among my children, named Lewis H. and Theodicia Chamberlain. I also give & bequeath to my wife & children
