State of Georgia In the name of God Amen,
Milton County I Gardner Gossby of said State
And County being of advanced age
but of sound mind & memory, knowing that I must
shortly depart this life deem it right also prefer better
as respects my family and myself that I should make
a disposition of the property, with which a kind Providence
has blessed me, I do therefore make this my
last will and testament hereby revoking and
annulling all others by me heretofore made.
1st I desire and direct that my body buried in a
decency Christian like manner suitable
to my circumstances and condition in life.

3rd I give and direct that all my just debts
be paid without delay by my executors herein after
named and appointed.

3rd I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife Sarah Crosby, Lot of Land Number
Three hundred and eleven (311) in the Sixth
District of Guinnett now DeKalb County,
containing Two hundred and fifty acres, with
all the rights members and appurtenances
to said Lot of Land, in anywise belonging
free from all charges and limitation what-
ever, to her ~~in~~ proper use benefit and behovf
forever, with full power to dispose of the same
by will or otherwise as she may deem proper
in the above named lot of Land to my wife
is in full extinguishment of her whole right of
dower, in my real estate.

3rd I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife
the ~~following~~ tools used on and belonging to the
farm on said lot of land and one barrel Horse
one Cow and Calf, and all the hogs, belonging
to the ^{home} ~~place~~ on ~~land~~ lot of land and all the
house hold and kitchen furniture, after the
death of my wife all the above named perishable
property to go to Effie Needlock my Neice.

4th After paying all my just debts and my burial
expenses I give and bequeath to John Carpenter
all my ready money, solvent notes and perish-
able property that remains.

5th I hereby constitute and appoint my friend
John Carpenter Executor of this my last will
and testament, this November 4th 1888.
