Sept-Term 1869.

Came into open Court, at this regular
term of the Court Robert A. Watson Jonas
Cain and Mrs Julian R. Graham and
being duly sworn, depose that they heard
Hiram Taylor use the words spoken in the
foregoing will, and that he Hiram Taylor
intended this as his last will, and that the
same was spoken voluntarily by him
while of sound, and disposing mind
and memory.
