1865-1882 by Jacob L. P. Hark Made and
deceased by him on the 14th day of September
1871, in our presence & in these words to us.

The said Jacob L. P. Hark being at his own
house in Milton County, Georgia on the first day
of September 1871, being in last sickness to
which he died, while the undersigned were
waiting on him, after calling on them to bear
witness of what he should say, declared as his
last will the following words:

I wish my debts ^{all} paid, then my wife to
have all my real estate as a home for herself and
my children during her natural life or
widowhood, and such of my personal prop-
erty as are not necessary for their support to be
sold, such as my Books, Medicine, Medical
Instruments, and other effects. My wife
to act as executrix. A few days after
this he died.

Given under our hands this 14th Sept-
1871,

Georgia. Before me came on the 2^d day of Oct
Milton County, 1871, at the regular term of the Court for
the purpose of proving the above named will of
Jacob L. P. Hark the testator to said will, viz., Dr. G. M. Howell

that time brought before me for probate by the executrix
Sarah Hark, who has filed a petition for probate of the
same, they the said testators, depose, that they leave the said
J. L. P. Hark speak the uncontradicted in the instrument purporting to
be his will and that he ought to have to bear in mind the words spoken
all this occurred only a short time before his death, and while he was
of sound and disposing mind memory, at the house of said decedent in this

In the Name of God Amen.

I James Lee do make and declare this my last
will and testament in manner and form following
First I resign my soul into the hands of Almighty
God, hoping and believing in a remission of my
sins by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ,
and my body I commit to the earth to be buried in
the grave yard at Unionhill Church by my Executor
hereinafter named, and my worldly estate I give
and divide as follows.

Next I will set off land \$10 11 22. 2-1/2 to be
sold at private sale or public outcry, and the pro-
ceeds of the sale of said lot of land, with the sale
of the Jack and wagon to pay off all the debts
against the estate of the testator, and also the
balance of the proceeds to be converted to the support
of the family for the present year 1863.

Next I will to Mr. A. B. Lee, S. C. Lee, Maud Lee
A. B. Lee my bodily heirs Seventy five dollars
each. Ann Autrey's Child will receive such
a part as his Mother would have received had she been
in life.

Next I will to my wife Susannah Lee all my
