DeKalb County, I, John Binion of said State
and County being of advanced age
and knowing that I must shortly depart this life
deem it right and proper, both as respects myself
and family, that I should make a disposition of
the property with which a kind Providence has blessed
me do therefore make this my last will & testament hereby
reversing all others heretofore made by me.

1st Item. I desire and direct that my body be
buried in a decent and Christian like manner
suitable to my circumstances and condition
in life

2^d Item. I desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my execu-
tors hereinafter appointed, as I am unwilling
my creditors should be delayed in their
rights.

3^r Item. I give and bequeath and desire
to my beloved wife Whiley. Lot of Land
Number three hundred and sixty four in the sixth
District of originally Gwinnett now DeKalb
County, Containing two hundred and fifty
acres with all the rights members and appur-
tenances to said lot of Land in any wise belong-
ing; to her own proper use benefit and behoof
for and during her life only and at her death
to belong to and be the property of my three
daughters to wit, Anne B. Binion, Emily
Binion and Elizabeth A. Binion jointly
and equally to their own proper use benefit
and behoof forever.

4th Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife for and during her natural (only) all
my household and kitchen furniture, and
all my farming utensils used on my
plantation ~~hereafter~~ after death to be the

property of and belong to my three daughters
named in the third item, equally.

5th Item I give and bequeath to my four sons
(to wit) Abram Binion, Gardner Binion,
Isaac E. Binion and Amarias E. Binion each
five dollars.

6th Item, The residue of my property wherever
and whatever it may be at my death, I give
and bequeath to my three daughters.

7th Item I hereby constitute and appoint my son
Samuel E. Binion Executor and my daughter
Ann B. Binion executrix of this my last will
and testament. This February the tenth 1849,
