The will of Morgan Fields

made and declared by him on the 24th day of January 1867, in our presence, under the following circumstances and in these words: The said Morgan Fields being at his own house in Milton County, Georgia on the 24th day of January 1867, being near unto death in his last sickness, from which he had suffered a short time, while the undersigned were present waiting on him; after calling on them to bear witness of what he should say, declared as his last will the following words,

I wish my just debts paid, and then my wife to have the benefit of all my effects during her widowhood, and after making the above statement he died in about twenty four hours.

Georgia I do solemnly swear this writing Milton County 3 Contains the last will and testament of Morgan Fields deceased, so far as I know or believe; and that I will well and truly execute the same by paying first his debts, and then the legacies contained in the said will as far as his goods and chattels will thereunto extend and the law charges me and that I will make a true and perfect inventory of the same so help me God.
