house in Mitchell County Georgia on the 19th day of October
1869 being near unto death in his last sickness from which
he had suffered but a short time and of sound and
disposing mind while the undersigned were present waiting
upon him after calling on him to declare witnesses of what he
should say, declared as his last will the following words
I wish the surplus property of my estate to be sold and
disposed of in the payment of my just debts and my
farm to be continued and property out of the said surplus
kept together for the benefit of my wife and children
And I also wish my Brother Henry Smith and a brother
in Law Joseph Ellis to be my Executors On the next day
the said Carr S. Smith died
