Know all men by these presents, That We James T. Cochran as principal and B. F. Cochran and J. P. Heath, Securities, are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary of said County, and his successors in Office and assigns, in the just and full sum of Twelve Thousand said Dollars for the payment of which sum to the said Ordinary and his successors in Office we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, in the whole, and for the whole sum jointly and severally, and firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our seals, and dated this 1st day September 1873

The condition of the above obligation is such That if the Above bound James T. Cochran do make a true and perfect inventory of the Goods, Chattels, rights, credits, lands and tenements of E. T. Hullard decd late of said County which have or shall come into the hands possession or knowledge of the said James T. Cochran Admin or the hands or possession of any person or persons for him, and the same so made to exhibit unto the said Ordinary, when he shall be hereunto required; and such goods Chattels credits, lands & tenements do well and truly administer according to law, and do make a just and true account of his actings & doings therein, when he shall thereunto be required, by the Court; shall deliver and pay to such person, or persons respectfully, as they may be entitled to the same by law; And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will or Testament was made by the deceased and the same be proven before the Court of Ordinary, and the Executor obtain a certificate of the Probate thereof and James T. Cochran in such case if required render and deliver up the said letters of Administration, then this obligation is to remain in full force and effect.
