Monroe County: I Abbeduce Turner of the State and county
Georgia: aforesaid being weak in body but of sound
mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and
testament in manner and form following in the name of God amen
(that is to say) First I give and bequeath my body to be buried
and my soul to God who gave it.
Second, I wish a sufficient quantity of my property as will pay
off all my debts and such of it as the Executors or a majority
of them shall in their judgment think can be best disposed
of for the convenience and advantage of the widow and children
and it shall be discretionary with the executors to sell the
property at private sale or at public outcry.

Thirdly I want a convenient place purchased for the settlement
of my family and what property remains after paying the debts
I want kept together to help the widow raise and educate the
children until the oldest child shall become of age or until
the widow shall marry in either case there shall be an equal
division between my widow and all my children viz. John, Jr.
Louisa Jane, Isaac T. William W. George W. and Richard H.
Turner.

I have the following persons my Executors to have the aforesaid will
Executed viz. Mary Turner, Abel Tatum, and Markach Turner, I do acknowledge
