and testament and dispose of my earthly effects as follows,

181. m. My will is that all my just debts be paid out of my effects
200. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy W. Namorah
three negro (servants) Charles a man, Lorin a woman and her child
Abington together with all her increase, All my household
and kitchen furniture of every description, All my plantations
and carpenters tools, All my corn and fodder and barrowed provisions
of all kinds together with the Crops if any there be, all my
ready money and my whole all my stock of horses my Ox
Cart and work Steers and one half of my stock of cattle and
two thirds of my stock of hogs my beehives together with
all my fowls, all the above to be at her disposal, I give
unto my wife the South half of my lot of land adjoining
Abraham Garry during her life time or widowhood.

277. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy M. Manna all
three negro (slaves) Charles a man, Loret a woman and her child
Abington together with all her increase, All my household
and kitchen furniture of every description, All my plantation
and Carpenter tools, All my corn and fodder and various provisions
of all kinds together with the Crops if any there be, all my
ready money and my watch all my stock of horses my Ox
Cart and work steers and one half of my stock of cattle and
two thirds of my stock of hogs my brethren together with
all my fowls all the above to be at her disposal, I give
unto my wife the South half of my lot of land adjoining
Hemlock Gary during her life time or widowhood.

It gives and bequeath to my son Charles Nomack his negro
Slave, a man and Yorks a Shaw the north half of my lot of
land, and the south half at my wife's death or marriage.

2th I gave and bequeath to my Grand son William Korte thirty
negroes Fanny a woman Milly a Girl, and Jane a girl and Jan
Fanny increase. And said William Korte to pay to the orphan
of Geo Korte two hundred dollars on his receiving said negroes

5th I gave and bequeath to my grand daughter Sarah Leabridge
two negroes, old eldely a woman and Daniel a man

6th I gave and bequeath to Wilkins Hunt one negro girl named Mary and on his morning said girl to pay to my grand daughter Charah but as it fifty dollars—

7. I give and bequeath to my ~~grand daughter~~ Alexander Hunt
one negro boy named berry and on his decease the said
negro boy to pay to my grand daughter, Sarah Cabaniss
dolly Collins

8th. And lastly, I constitute Chauncy Noxon, Henry Targ, and William Hunt my executors to see this my last will and testament is faithfully carried into effect, In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of May 1833

dec'd sign said public and declare this instrument of writing to be
his last will and testament and that they subscribed the same
as witnesses and that they believe at the time of the execution of the
will that the said Abraham Monack dec'd was in disposing mind
and memory, known to in open Court this 5 day May 1834

Chattels will thereto extend and the law charge me and that I
will make a true and perfect inventory of all such goods and
Chattels to help me god; known to in open Court
this 5 day of May 1834
