I Byrd, Sworn of the county of
 Monroe in the State of Georgia being in low the alt. but of sound (and
 disposing (mind (and memory) do make (and ordain this my last will
 and testament.

It is my will (and desire that all my property real (and personal
 after the payment of my just debts (should be kept together (and
 managed to the best advantage for the maintenance of my beloved
 wife (and children (and for bestowing on my children a proper education.
 When my youngest child arrives at the age of twenty one years,
 then the (said) property or what may remain thereof with the increase
 (and profits is to be divided among my wife (and children equally
 according to the statute of distributions now of force in this state.
 In case however my beloved wife shall marry again
 before the arrival of my youngest child at the age of
 twenty one years then it is my will that on her marrying

a full part of my estate according to what she would be entitled to under the Statute of distributions should be assigned (and set apart) to her - (and) assignment to be so made as to make her share of my estate, as it may then stand equal in all respects with a child's part. After such assignment of my wife's part in case of her marriage, my will is that what belongs to my children should still be kept together (and managed for their support and education until the youngest arrives at full age.
