of the sum of four thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said Eli Brown
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged with bargained and
sold by the present do bargain and sell to the said Eli Brown the
same all those parts and parcels of land, situate, lying, and
being in the county of Monroe aforesaid and in fifth district thereof
bounded as follows, beginning at the south east corner of lot number
one hundred and fifty seven (157) and running north to the original
north east corner of said lot and continuing north on the line of lot
number one hundred and fifty six sixty seven poles to a stake thence
west across last named lot of land to the original west line thence south
to (and with) the line of (lot No 157) to the south west corner of said lot
No 157 thence east to Deer Creek, thence down said creek on the south side
therof to Evans line so as to include all the land which may at any
time be overflowed or washed by the mill pond or backling of water by
the mills thence with said Evans line to a poplar on the original line
