Item third I give and bequeath to my step Daughter Francis L Bird my negro man Mark about fifty five years of age to my said step daughter forever.

Item fourth I give and bequeath to my son George Benson Bird one hundred Dollars to be paid from the hire of Sarah D F Bird negro girl about twenty years of age together with all the rest of my property both real and personal whatsoever and whatever it may be during her natural life and to her children forever and in case the said Sarah D F Bird should die without child or children then the above named property shall be equally divided between my three sons to wit James R Bird John L Bird & George B Bird.

Item sixth I constitute and appoint my son James R Bird executor to this my last will and testament
