I David Allison being in sound mind (and memory) thank be to God for the same, calling to mind the most ability of anybody (and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will (and testament), that is to say,

First of all, I recommend my soul to God who gave it, (and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of the Almighty God. And touching such worldly estate that it has pleased God to keep me with in this life, I give devise (and bequeath) of the same in the following manner, to wit, 1st after all my just debts be paid I give (and bequeath) unto my beloved wife Matilda Allison all my ready money, notes (and accounts) (and all my estate both real (and personal) to her (and her heirs) forever:

2nd I do hereby make, appoint (and ordain my beloved wife Matilda Allison my executrix to carry this my last will (and testament) into effect. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand (and seal) this 8th day of August 1832.
