

George and in the name of God amen I David  
Monroe My<sup>3</sup> Wright being afflicted in body but of strong  
mind and memory do make and constitute this my last  
will and Testament. As witness  
I the whole of my property both personal & real I  
leave to my wife<sup>1</sup> Cut down to be equally divided  
among them in following manner It is my wish  
that all the property be kept together on the pre-  
mises where I now live until the youngest child  
be comes of age when the oldest child be comes of  
lawful age wish that an equal share may be  
divided from the common stock of property and  
given to it and her man now with my other children  
as they be come of age until it is all equally  
divided, that is an equal part for each child and one  
for my wife But I wish it distinctly understood that  
the land or premises whereon I reside is not to be  
taken into consideration in my division that may take  
place until my youngest child be comes of age at  
which time & when that to be equally divided between  
my wife and children. Should my wife again marry  
before my youngest child becomes of lawful age I will  
that her proportionable part, that is, a share equal  
with one of the children be divided off to her as  
soon as she may demand it or when the property  
and crop if then should be in growing will suffice  
with it. I wish all my just debts paid as early  
as possible and if my present Crop should not  
be sufficient I wish my executors to sell any of  
my personal property that they may think advisable  
for that purpose or a lot of Land I own in  
Marinette County on such terms as they may think  
advantageous. If at any time my executors should  
desire it for the interest of my family to make sale  
of the premises whereon I live they are authorized to do so  
and I do hereby authorize my executors to do so in  
all cases as they may think most advisable  
for the interest of the family as I would do  
myself personally present.  
I do hereby appoint my friends William Albinson &  
John Green executors and my wife Martha S. Wright  
executrix to carry this my last will & Testament  
into effect to witness when of I do hereunto
